Perfect day for Strawnfest 2017

The weather could not have been more perfect for folks to come out and enjoy Strawnfest on June 24 this year!

Crowds were out and about early in town shopping for deals and one-of-a-kind bargains at the citywide garage sales.

A new event this year was the Blaze the Trail Walk at 8 a.m. Over 40 walkers and runners christened the new walk/bike trail which originates just south of the New Strawn City Lake and Park and meanders southward toward the Neosho River.

No dumping

It has come to the attention of the City that folks have been using the dumpster at the Community Building as if it were the county landfill. Trash bags, boxes, broken appliances and even furniture have recently been spotted spilling over the sides and top of the dumpster. As a reminder, the dumpster at the community building is NOT for public use. It is placed there so those who rent the community building have a place to dispose of any trash they generate. It was never intended to be used as a "dumping ground" for stuff you don't want anymore, or items that came from the depths of your garage after you cleaned it. That's what the county landfill is for. So, please, be courteous and stop treating the dumpster as if it were your own private, giant trash can.

Zoning news

As a reminder, New Strawn is a zoned city and has (and enforces) zoning regulations. Permits are required for most projects, including new homes and additions, storage sheds and accessory buildings larger than 10'x12', fences, driveways, pools and some signs. The permitting process has been "stream-lined" and no longer requires council's approval. The Zoning Administrator, City Superintendent and Code Enforcement Officer ensure all permits are in order and in compliance with zoning regulations and City Code before approving a permit. This means folks no longer have to wait (sometimes weeks) to have a building permit approved at the next City Council meeting.

Also, New Strawn has specific zoning districts, so it's always a good idea to make sure your project is allowable in the zone you wish to build in or start a business in. If you are told your project is a "no go" you always have the right to appeal the decision or request a change in zoning or a variance or special use. Those cases are heard by our Board of Zoning Appeals, who then make a recommendation to Council as to whether to approve or disapprove a request.

Current members of the New Strawn Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals are Richard Croll – chairman, Mike Skillman, Doug Feldhausen, Robert Harkrader and Ron Strawder.

New Strawn post office closes

As of July 1, the New Strawn post office officially closed for business. The closure came on the heels of the recent illness and hospitalization of Lonnie Hoskins, who contracted to run the post office. His return to work seemed unlikely. Folks with boxes rented (the city included) had the option of renting a box at the Burlington post office, or erecting a mailbox at their residence or place of business. The city opted to put up a mailbox and all correspondence to City Hall will now need to be addressed to: City of New Strawn, 215 N. Main St., New Strawn, KS 66839.

Mr. Hoskins will be missed around here and we want to thank him for the years of service he gave to the City of New Strawn keeping a post office open! His sunny demeanor, ready smile (or joke) and love of Royals baseball helped brighten the day of those he came into contact with. He didn't just sell stamps and mail letters ... he peddled infectious cheerfulness and genuine warmth to his patrons. We wish him all the best.

At the May regular council meeting, Mayor Petterson recommended the following appointments and designations: Janell Templeton - City Clerk; Brenda Klubek - City Treasurer; Denise McNabb - City Attorney; Ron Parkey - Building Inspector; Carl Ware – Zoning Administrator; Jim Weeks – Council Liaison to Planning Commission & Board of Zoning Appeals; Citizens State Bank - Official City Depository; The Coffey County Republican – Official Newspaper. Council ratified the mayor's appointments with a 5-0 vote. Mayor Petterson also recommended the reappointment of Richard Croll and Mike Skillman to the New Strawn Planning Commission and Board of Zoning Appeals. Their terms will expire May 31, 2020.
